Trinity Masterworks Choir to give online concert, Thursday, Oct. 28, at 7:00 p.m.

Trinity Masterworks Choir has begun rehearsing for a virtual concert to be given this fall on Thursday, October 28, 2021 at 7pm.

We are rehearsing in a new space which allows us to socially distance, wear masks and sing in the round which creates a more unified sound. There are 20-30 participants including high school, college t and community adults (who are just thrilled to be returning to being able to sing). Phillip McMullen will lead the group in presenting two wonderful works.

The first piece, 'Snow Angel', is a 5-movement piece, created by Sarah Quartel, a Canadian composer, conductor and educator. This piece explores the themes of love, rebirth and beauty through the eyes of children and the heavenly army of angels that watch over them who are yearning to make a difference in children's lives. This will be accompanied by cello, piano and djembe.

The second piece is by familiar composer Dan Forest. Our very first piece as a Masterworks choir was his work, "Requiem for the Living". The piece for this fall is, "Three Nocturnes", and is written for chorus and percussion. It takes three different texts about stars which all express wonder at the night sky and the composer has used the style of the poem to drive the style of music from sonic to staccato to majestic.



Diocese of Puerto Rico to join Province II,
pending General Convention approval.

The Diocese of Puerto Rico is set to switch from Province IX to Province II after Province II's synod unanimously voted to [accept its request](#) on Sept. 9. The change will go before the 80th General Convention in July 2022 for final approval.

The Diocese of Puerto Rico has been in [Province IX](#) – which currently consists of seven dioceses in Latin America and the Caribbean – since it was [readmitted to The Episcopal Church](#) in 2003. In April, the diocese presented a resolution to the Province IX synod stating its desire to change provinces, which the synod approved unanimously. The diocese then convened a special convention in July to determine which new province it would join, choosing among Provinces II, III and IV, according to Province II Council lay representative Yvonne O'Neal, who represented her province at the convention. Bishops William Klusmeyer of West Virginia and Gregory Brewer of Central Florida represented Provinces III and IV, respectively.

After presentations from the provinces, the diocesan convention voted to join Province II on the sixth ballot. [Province II](#) – “the international Atlantic province,” as it calls itself – consists of the dioceses in the states of New York and New Jersey, Haiti, Cuba, the Virgin Islands and the Convocation of Episcopal Churches in Europe.

Before the Province II synod's September vote to accept the diocese, Acting President Bishop DeDe Duncan-Probe, bishop of Central New York, invited Puerto Rico Bishop Rafael Morales to address the synod. In his overview of the diocese's work, Morales “highlighted the diocesan seminary, the funeral and grief counseling program, the new radio station with its many programs ... and how this all feeds into social media,” [O'Neal wrote](#). “One of the most notable achievements of the Diocese of Puerto Rico is the St. Luke's Episcopal Health System, the biggest on the island, [which] has been in operation for more than 100 years.”

In presenting the resolution, O'Neal noted connections between the Dioceses of Puerto Rico, Cuba, Haiti and the Virgin Islands, including the fact that the Virgin Islands were in the Diocese of Puerto Rico until 1962. O'Neal also told the synod "that Puerto Rico was not coming to Province II seeking financial assistance."

"The diocese has income-producing enterprises such as the St. Luke's Health System," O'Neal wrote. "Eight years ago, the Diocese of Puerto Rico had an endowment of \$26 million amassed by the retiring bishop, an endowment that has grown substantially since then."

The Diocese of Puerto Rico will present a resolution approving the switch at General Convention scheduled to be held in Baltimore, Maryland, next July. The diocese also plans to celebrate 150 years of Anglicanism on the island next year.

Finance: Virginia Becker reported. A motion was made by Sue Torrance, seconded by Karin Wheelock, to receive the treasurer's report.

- A transfer of funds from the Snowden Lane cash account to the general fund may be made in September.
- Current balance of the Building Fund: \$1,201.25.
- Pledge envelopes for 2022 have been ordered.

Memorial Fund Report: Virginia Becker reported.

- Current balance: \$2,867.28. No change since last meeting.

Buildings and Grounds: Fr. Clement reported.

- Elevator-lift inspection was conducted on June 23.
- Amherst Exterminators sprayed the building on June 23.
- DFT fire system inspection was conducted on July 16.
- Floor cleaning and waxing is scheduled for August 10.
- Fire extinguisher inspection has been rescheduled to August.
- Fredonia building inspection is scheduled for early September.

- **2020 Parish Audit:** See attached. The Parish Audit Committee presented its report to vestry, with its recommendations. Doreen Gould made a motion, seconded by Janeil Rey, for vestry to receive this report as presented. Motion carried.
- A restructuring of the work of vestry during regular meetings will take place. The primary focus of Vestry will be on current conditions and reports of Parish Finance and Building and Grounds. Groups, Guilds, and Committees of this Parish (Congregational Ministries) will provide updated reports to vestry on a need-to-know basis, or at the request of vestry.
- Motion made by Janeil Rey, seconded by Sue Torrance: Resolved: All Parish Committees, Guilds, or Assembly of Trinity Church that have access to a bank checking or savings account associated with the group, must meet two requirements. First, the group must provide all necessary records for an annual parish audit. Second, the group must retain written and approved minutes of the assembly, especially those relating to actions taken on monetary matters related to any financial account. Motion carried.
- Vestry agreed to take a summer break from meeting in August.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:25 p.m. with a motion made by Doreen Gould. Vestry ended its time together with prayer.

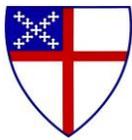
