

**Excused**: Virginia Becker, Treasurer; Cathy Berner; Jenn Wilkins, Clerk.

**Call to Order**: Fr. Clement called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m., with an opening prayer.

**Meeting Agenda**: Agenda approved with a motion made by Sally Ludlum, seconded by Ann Sullivan.

**Approval of Minutes:** A motion was made by Janeil Rey, seconded by Mary Lou Vercant to approve the November 28, 2023 meeting minutes. Motion carried.

# <u>Committee Reports: Finance / Building and Grounds:</u>

**Finance**: Report prepared by Ginny Becker and presented for consideration by Fr. Clement. Mary Lou Vercant made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Sally Ludlum. Motion carried.

- General Fund: Regular monthly expenses were met. We received a bill from Gugino Heating and Plumbing for the first round of work (\$425) which was paid in December. Another bill is forthcoming for the work done in December.
- Increases for 2024: Forward Movement booklets from \$28.50 to \$36.25 per quarter (15 small and 10 large print); Bahgat & Laurito Bahgat for bookkeeping from \$175

- to \$200 per month; Snow plowing from \$600 to \$700 per season.
- <u>2024 Stewardship</u>: To date, 26 pledge cards have been returned in the amount of \$96,696.
- <u>Building Fund</u>: The balance at the end of October was \$611.15.
- <u>Memorial Fund Report</u>: The balance remains at \$3,072.28.

## **Buildings and Grounds**: Fr. Clement reported.

 Gugino Heating and Plumbing continues to conduct work on the furnace for the church. The issue of maintaining a set temperature remains. The furnace was cleaned and inspected. A few other issues have been noted.

# **Rector's Report**: Fr. Clement reported.

- Fr. Clement expressed his appreciation to everyone who recently helped decorate the church for the festive season. He hopes those persons who travel out-of-town will have a safe and joyous holiday. He looks forward to the Christmas Eve service.
- He will coordinate an upcoming class for confirmation candidates.
- The calendar for Sunday Godly Play lessons will need to be replanned for the first part of 2024, as Janeil Rey will be absent for a period of time.

#### **Old Business:**

 Vestry noted that a second letter, which was written by the same person as a letter last month, was received by each member of vestry to their respective residence. The content of the letter was discussed. Vestry voiced concern for the letter writer.

## New Business: None.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:44 p.m. with a motion made by Janeil Rey, seconded by Karin Wheelock. Carried. Vestry concluded its time together with prayer. The next meeting will be held on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>January 16 at 5:00pm</u>.

# **EPIPHANY TEA 2024**

Trinity Church Women will be holding their 91st Epiphany Tea on Sunday, February 4th at 2pm in Garland Hall behind Trinity Episcopal Church, 11 Day St. Fredonia, NY.

This tea is a yearly event that is held during the Epiphany season which goes from January 6 until Ash Wednesday. In years gone by it was a very fancy tea for all the church women and others from any Episcopal Church. Today it is a more casual affair but the Silver tea service is still used and a wonderful array of tea foods are on the table. Come and bring a friend. The guest speaker who will chat with the group for about 15 minutes before the tea is served will be Deborah Dibble, Director of the Student Health Center, SUNY Fredonia. The topic this year is the schools new Student Food Insecurity Program.

Food insecurity is a real cause of concern which directly impacts the students' ability to learn. This program started in 2016 with just some basic staples made available to get the students through to the end of the semester. Because of the rising need the program has evolved into much more. If you plan to attend instead of the usual opportunity to make a free will offering that is given to the speaker, we ask that you bring along some single serving non-perishable meals such Mac/cheese, soups, rice dishes, noodle dishes etc. We look forward to having you join us.
