Trinity Episcopal Church Vestry Minutes October 15, 2024

As approved at the November Meeting

Excused:

Call to Order: Fr. Clement called the meeting to order at 5:34 p.m.

Meeting Agenda: Agenda approved with a motion made by Cathy Berner, seconded by Melissa Eichmann.

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made by Jake Wilkins, seconded by Cathy Berner to approve the September 17, 2024 meeting minutes. Motion carried.

<u>Committee Reports: Finance / Building and Grounds</u>:

Finance: Report prepared by Ginny Becker and presented. Ann Sullivan made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Melisa Eichmann. Motion carried.

- General Fund: All regular monthly bills were paid along with Forward Movement, the Village of Fredonia for water/sewer and building inspection, Amherst Exterminators, and the quarterly Church Insurance.
- <u>Building Fund</u>: The balance at the end of September was \$5,611.54.
- <u>Memorial Fund</u>: The balance remains \$3,072.28.
- <u>Music Fund</u>: The September cash balance was \$461.37.

Buildings & Grounds: Fr. Clement reported.

- Bought a replacement filter for the dehumidifier.
- The choir room piano was tuned.
- Gugino Heating and Plumbing will service the furnace soon, as the unit is shut down. It is hoped that this work will allow some time

before extensive work, as discussed at previous meetings, will be conducted.

Congregational Ministries

Flower Guild: Melisa Eichmann reported.

• Current balance: \$636.62. The Fresh & Fancy Florist bill was \$360, reducing the balance of the fund to \$276.62. However, an additional \$60 was recently deposited.

Rector's Report: Fr. Clement reported.

- We welcome a community knitting group which will begin meeting at the parish, possibly in November. They will meet each week on Thursday mornings, 9:15 until 11:30. The greater community is invited to join with them. The knitting group is well known in the community and they have been in operation for several years, working on their own projects and also items for donation.
- The final grant award check was received for parish The College Kitchen project.
- Attended the recent diocesan convention with the parish delegates: Jenn Wilkins, Jake Wilkins, and Lisa Sedlmayer. A fact sheet was presented to vestry, which shows preliminary results from the on-going evaluation of The Partnership diocese. The final report will be presented to the Standings Committees of each diocese early next year, followed by a special convention to be called in May.
- Thank you to Tonya Piede who recently filled-in a few times as organist for Sunday worship.
- Sad to report the death of parishioner, Robbie Mancuso, after long illness. The funeral is scheduled for October 19.
- Several transfers into the parish have recently been made received.
- Fr. Clement will take vacation time in November. A service of Morning Prayer will be held on Sundays, November 17 and 24, officiated by the Warden.

Old Business

- The Autumn Harvest Potluck Sign-up form is available on the bulletin board.
- We've enjoyed fellowship with the college students during coffee hour, and for their involvement in the life of the parish.

New Business

- Stewardship Committee: Ginny Becker reminded vestry that now is the time to form this committee. Vestry approves of Jenn Wilkins and Melisa Eichmann with the task of helping her with this important stewardship process. A proposed budget for next year will need to be presented to vestry at its December meeting.
- It was noted that Jinny Kopp has expressed interest in hosting a gathering to play dominoes at the church during the week.
 More information forthcoming.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:43p.m. with a motion made by Jake Wilkins, seconded by Cathy Berner. Carried.

Vestry concluded its time together with prayer. The next meeting will be held on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 19</u> <u>@ 5:30pm</u> (A Zoom link will be sent for those persons who will be out-of-town).

<u>Honduras Health Horizons</u> Mission Trip



Dear Parish Community,

In Honduras, a person's access to healthcare is often determined by two critical factors: financial resources and proximity to urban centers. The unfortunate reality is that those with means receive care, while those without are left to suffer without options. The country's lack of basic infrastructure—like paved roads—makes it even harder for rural communities to access the care they desperately need.

One of the initiatives we've undertaken to help address this gap is supporting expectant mothers in these underserved areas. Through pregnancy screenings, the donation of prenatal vitamins, and providing essential baby supplies like clothes and diaper rash ointment, we aim to make a tangible difference in the lives of mothers and their newborns.

In 2023, I had the privilege of traveling to Honduras with faculty member Dr. Ted Lee, a group of prehealth students from SUNY Fredonia, and a dedicated medical team to provide primary care in remote villages. My time there remains one of the most cherished experiences of my nursing career. We worked alongside American and Honduran physicians, pharmacists, nurses, and interpreters to provide care to over 500 people in need. While our resources were limited, the beauty of the work was undeniable: when a patient came to the clinic with a problem, and we had a solution, they walked away with that solution—no insurance red tape, no financial barriers, just care. This is what makes nursing so profoundly rewarding.

In a little under two months, I'll be returning to Honduras with another group, and I am reaching out to ask for your support. I serve on the board of Honduras Health Horizons (H₃), the organization that coordinates these missions. H₃ relies heavily on donations to fund medication, medical supplies, and scholarships for students in our program. Without donations, the students pay out of pocket to attend, which is often not feasible.

If you would like to help, we are accepting donations of the following items for our maternity kits for expectant mothers:

- Unisex baby clothes (neutral colors preferred for easier distribution)
- Picture books, especially those that tie colors, animals, and objects to their written word (Spanish language preferred)
- Cloth diapers, plastic pants, diaper pins, onesies, socks, sun hats, bibs, and receiving blankets
- Non-battery-operated toys
- Lightweight tote bags (as these are more practical and less bulky than diaper bags)

Monetary donations are also greatly appreciated and will go directly to purchasing essential medical supplies and medications for the mission.

Thank you so much for considering a donation. Your generosity will directly impact the lives of those who need it most. Together, we can help bring hope and healing to the people of Honduras. A collection box will be placed in the foyer of Garland Hall until **December 22nd, 2024**.
