Trinity Episcopal Church Vestry Minutes May 20, 2025

As approved at the June Meeting

Present: Sally Ludlum, Warden; Jake Wilkins; Jenn Wilkins; Ann Sullivan; Cathy Berner; Melisa Eichmann; Virginia Becker, Treasurer.

Excused: The Reverend James Clement, Rector.

Call to Order: Sally Ludlum called the meeting to order at 5:33 p.m., with an opening prayer.

Meeting Agenda: Agenda approved with a motion made by Cathy Berner, seconded by Melisa Eichmann.

Add NEW Business – Volunteer Fredonia
 Fire Department Fundraiser.

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made by Cathy Berner, seconded by Jake Wilkins to approve the April 15, 2025 meeting minutes. Motion carried.

<u>Committee Reports: Finance / Building and</u> Grounds:

Finance: Report prepared by Ginny Becker and presented. Jake Wilkins made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Jenn Wilkins. Motion carried.

- General Fund: All anticipated bills for April were paid, as well as Amherst Exterminators, The Observer, and The College Kitchen.
- <u>Building Fund</u>: The balance at the end of April was \$4,443.43, after an invoice for Vacanti Electric and downpayment for Gugino Plumbing and Heating were made.
- <u>Memorial Fund</u>: The balance remains \$3,172.28.
- <u>Music Fund</u>: The balance is \$239.56.
- Snowden Lane Partners: A transfer from Master account made to building fund in April for downpayment of furnace work. On 4/11/25, \$8,000 was transferred from Master Cash to the Building Fund to cover the down payment for the furnace. Additional \$15K was transferred to General Fund.

Buildings & Ground: reported by Ginny Becker.

- Gugino Heating and Plumbing began work on the furnace this week. The project is expected to be completed within a few days. The remaining balance for this work is due upon completion.
- Amherst Exterminators conducted its exterior protection.

Congregational Ministries:

Flower Guild:

- The previous balance was \$660.07. Payments made to Brigiotta's for \$397.00 and to Fresh & Fancy for \$188.00. Received two deposits totaling \$60.00, bringing the current balance to \$135.07.
- Updates were made to the Flower Guild Account. Ginny Becker was added as a signer, in addition to Melisa Eichmann.

<u>The College Kitchen</u>: Plans a Hot Dog Lunch for Farm Festival Weekend in August.

TECW:

- Additional funds were received to contribute to the Rummage Sale for a grand total of \$1,025.25 funds raised.
- Next meeting is in June; no meetings to take place in July or August.
- At the last meeting discussion regarding baking for July at the Episcopal Service Chautauqua Institute (Tuesday, July 15). Additional information regarding sign-ups will be shared by Doreen Gould.

Kitchen Krew

Old Business

• <u>Fredonia Fire Department</u>: Jenn Wilkins made a motion for the parish to donate \$100 to the annual fundraiser, seconded by Melisa Eichmann. All approved.

- Conversation was held regarding a parish picnic or indoor meal gathering in autumn, possibly in September. Further conversation will take place at the next meeting.
- Parish Treasurer and Vestry discussed the rotation schedule for the counting of offerings on Sundays. Jenn Wilkins suggested a group training. A tentative schedule was made for the upcoming weeks. The Assistant Treasurer position will need to be filled as well.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:28 p.m. with a motion made by Jake Wilkins, seconded by Jenn Wilkins. Carried. Vestry concluded its time together with prayer. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 17, 2025 @ 5:30 p.m.
